### In the Good Old Days of June

In June 1923, the average annual income was \$3,227. The average taxpayer paid a rate of 2.67% of their income. The average cost of a new house was \$6,296, or about \$80,000 in today's dollars. A loaf of bread was 12 cents, a gallon of milk was 60 cents, butter was 70 cents a pound, steak was 40 cents a pound, and a dozen eggs were 68 cents.

## Flower of the Month - Rose

The flower for June is the rose, perhaps the most universal symbol of romantic love in the world. A yellow rose indicates platonic love, a dark pink signifies gratitude, and a white rose symbolizes purity. Roses are also the emblem of the Egyptian god Horus, god of silence. Because of the flower's association with silence, Romans referred to secret meetings and clandestine affairs as having been conducted *sub rosa*, which translates to "under the rose".

## Birrhstone of the Month - Pearl

The birthstone of June is the pearl. Pearls have been celebrated as highly valued gemstones and objects of beauty for many centuries. This is probably why the word *pearl* has become a metaphor for something rare and valuable. A natural pearl is one that forms in the wild, in an oyster, without any human intervention. Natural pearls are rare. A cultured pearl, on the other hand, is one that is "grown" on a pearl farm. Most pearls on the market today are cultured pearls.
