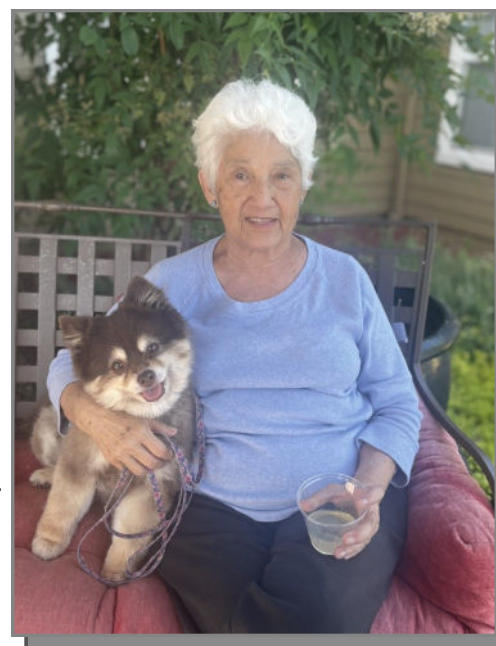
Estelita “Stella” Becerra

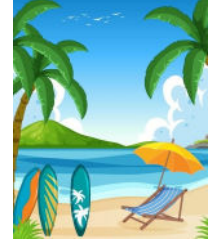

Thank you for your patience during this process and from here on we look forward to many pleasant activities and opportunities for everyone from all three buildings to enjoy.

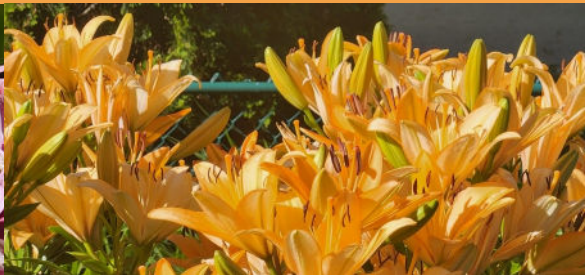

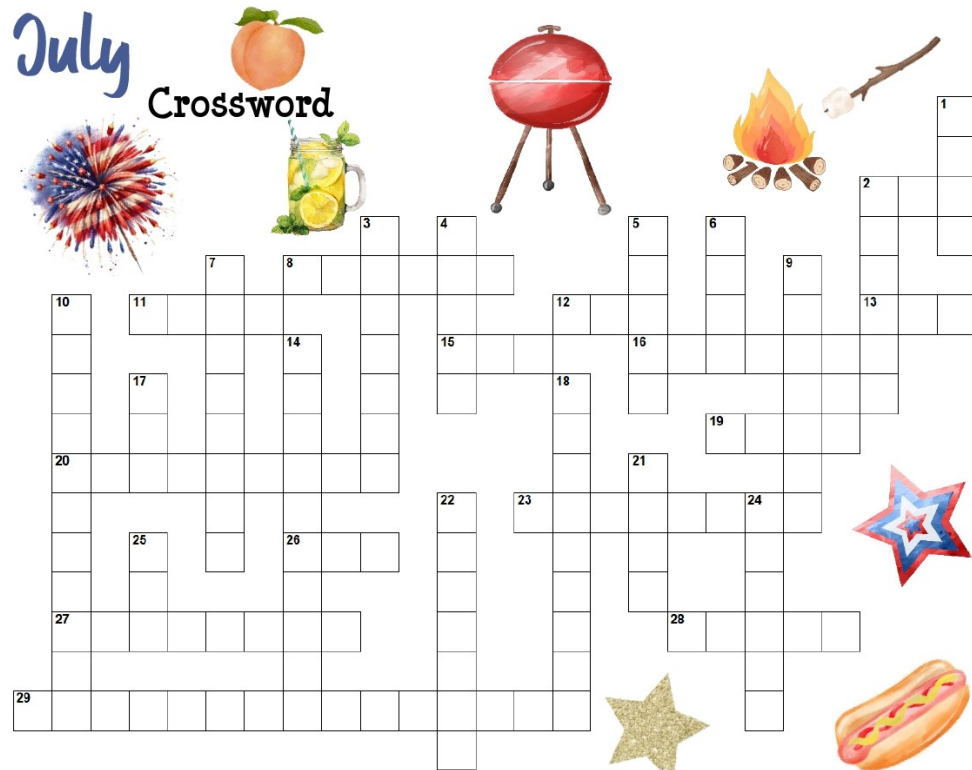
