Back to the '70s

September often marks a return to routines, and during the 1970s, it also signaled the start of a new television season. Families gathered around the television to watch the first episodes of returning favorites and discover new shows that would soon become part of everyday conversation.

The 1970s are often remembered as a golden age of television sitcoms. Programs such as *All in the Family*, *The Mary Tyler Moore Show*, and *Happy Days* reflected changing social attitudes while providing plenty of humor. Their characters, catchphrases, and storylines became cultural touchstones, influencing entertainment for decades to come.

Music was equally influential. The decade saw the rise of disco, a dance-driven style that filled clubs and radio stations. 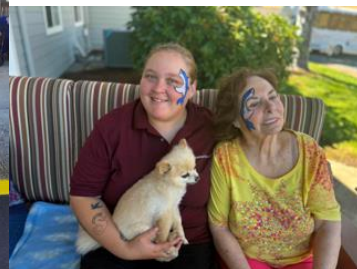

Nurse Leah's Note:

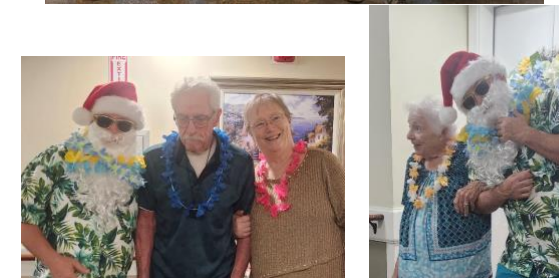
With cold and flu season upon us, I wanted to address how we handle illness in the community. We ask that residents report any signs of respiratory illness such as fever, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, congestion/runny nose, headache, change in mentation, GI symptoms (this would include abdominal pain, diarrhea, nausea/vomiting), new loss of taste or smell, or any other change in baseline. If someone has a fever or respiratory infection symptoms, associates will implement infection control precautions and notify the nurse or executive director immediately. We will ask the person to isolate in their apartment until they are no longer contagious as determined by CDC criteria. This varies based on the type of illness. I hope that we all stay healthy this season and can keep illnesses to a minimum! Remember that frequent handwashing is one of the best ways to help prevent the spread of germs!
